In compliance with Pennsylvania Department of Education guidance, Abraxas Youth Center (AYC) created this Health and Safety Plan to serve as the local guidelines for all instructional and non-instructional school activities. Abraxas Youth Center developed this Health and Safety Plan in consultation with local health agencies to meet the unique needs of our residential student population. This plan includes flexibility to adapt to changing conditions and focuses on professional learning and communications, to ensure all stakeholders in the Abraxas Youth Center community are fully informed and prepared for phased or rapid changes of school throughout the facility. This plan will be presented to the Abraxas Board of Directors within 30 days for approval. Abraxas Youth Center will continue to monitor our Health and Safety Plan throughout the year and update as needed. Any revisions will be reviewed by the Abraxas Board of Directors, as needed, and posted on our public website, https://abraxasyfs.com

The health and safety of the students and staff at Abraxas Youth Center continues to be of the utmost importance. The Abraxas Youth Center will continue to monitor available information related to the COVID-19 Pandemic, and take the necessary steps to respond appropriately. We will continue to follow the latest mandates issued by the Governor's Office, the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PA DoH), and the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE). As conditions change related to COVID-19, protocols are subject to change. Included within this plan are strategies from our previous health and safety plan that are both practical and have proven effective.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

The Abraxas Youth Center will provide three instructional strategies for the 2021-2022 school year.

- 1. Full in-person, 5 days per week, instructional model
- 2. Hybrid model delivering instruction on units and in school if quarantine becomes necessary using partial virtual instruction
- 3. Full virtual instructional model in guarantine environments

While we are planning for a full in-person instructional model there may be times when we must shift to short term virtual models if warranted by current health conditions and/or through direct guidance from the PA DoH.

The Abraxas Youth Center has multiple resources available to respond to the social and emotional needs of students. We will continue to provide these resources to families on an as needed basis. Additionally, all staff has access to an Employee Assistance Program.

As Abraxas Youth Center is a residential treatment facility, we provide all meals and snacks for students. We will continue to follow Federal, State and local regulations and the advice of the CDC to insure proper safe food delivery.

Masks are encouraged for those who are concerned about their health or have health issues. Staff: currently required to wear masks regardless of vaccination status. Visitors: required to wear a mask regardless of vaccination status. Abraxas will continue to review recommendations from the CDC and implement prevention and mitigation measures, to the greatest extent practicable, based on student/school

b. Modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);	AYC will continue the use of strategic grouping and cohorts, as needed, to allow for physical distancing. In all school environments non-essential furniture has been removed and individual student desks will be physically distanced to the maximum extent feasible.
c. Handwashing and respiratory etiquette;	AYC will continue to encourage and practice sound handwashing and respiratory etiquette as it did during the 2020/2021 school year. AYC will continue mandatory hand washing and/or use of hand sanitizer after using the bathroom and before/after eating.
d. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation;	AYC will continue to clean, provide ventilation and maintain healthy facilities as during the 2020/2021 school year. Frequently touched surfaces - Cleaned and disinfected daily, including desktops, chairs, electronic devices door handles, sink handles, etc. Building ventilation: Maximize outside air flow within the capacity of our building. All HVAC systems will be set to maximize airflow and ventilation and strategic use of portable air purifiers. Physical Education/Art/Music All shared materials will be sanitized daily and in between uses. Lessons will be adjusted to focus on minimizing and/or eliminating shared materials.
e. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	AYC will continue to contact trace and notify close contacts of a positive case. AYC will follow the CDC guidelines as required by PA DoH/PDE. f. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing;	Visitors, volunteers, and all staff will be screened for COVID-19 for entry of the building. Visitors and volunteers experiencing COVID-19 symptoms or

	COVID-19 exposure as defined by CDC will be denied entry to the building. Staff experiencing COVID-19 symptoms or COVID-19 exposure as defined by CDC will be sent home. Depending on vaccination status, symptoms, and/or exposure details staff may need to isolate for 10 days or until free of fever and symptoms for 24 hours, a doctor's note clearing the individual to return, or documentation of a negative COVID-19 test. Each staff case will be individualized and follow latest CDC guidelines.
	AYC medical department will screen, test, and monitor all students for the first 5 days after initial admission to the program. After initial 5 day quarantine and negative testing, students will be integrated into the general school population. Ongoing student screening for symptoms will be completed by AYC medical department. Any student experiencing symptoms will be administered a COVID test completed by AYC medical department.
g. Efforts to provide <u>vaccinations to school</u> <u>communities</u> ;	AYC has promoted and provided opportunities for staff and students for the COVID-19 vaccination. AYC will continue to offer local and regional options for vaccinations for students and staff.
h. Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	Individualized health and safety plans will be developed in collaboration with family staff, and probation offices, as needed, for any student requiring additional accommodations and safety measures.
i. Coordination with state and local health officials.	AYC will continue communication with local health experts and state contacts within the PA DoH.
